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Bishopsgate Ward Club Hon. Treasurer's Report For the Year Ended 31 March 2025

Our results this year are showing a similar relatively small deficit before functions as in the previous year. Our member numbers have declined slightly, and we need to continue to bring new members to the Club and carefully monitor our expenditure going forward.

As detailed on page 5 the events held during the year showed a small surplus, including the value of member £20 event discount vouchers redeemed.

A memorial service was held, together with The Musicians' Company, for Past Presidents David Lancaster and Eugenie Maxwell. The Musicians' Company contributed financially towards the event but there was a residual net cost to the Club which added to the final operating deficit for the year.

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Most of the Club's assets are held in an interest-bearing reserve account with our bankers and in Government Stock and although the Stock valuation has fallen this is an unrealised loss and should be viewed as such. The holding was purchased as a long-term investment and continues to be so.

The current weakness in the Gilt markets has not been seen since 2008. The weakness reflects growing unease about Britain's economic health and global market pressures, and the UK Gilt market has a high sensitivity and correlation with US Treasuries.

The holding is guaranteed by the UK Treasury to redeem at 100p in 2045 i.e., £36,000 and in the meantime will continue to pay an income of £1,260 per annum. This equates to a current yield to redemption of 5.13%.

The current economic climate can be described as extremely volatile, and as such no action should be taken. As interest rates continue to ease back, the price of this Treasury Stock will recover and then give a more accurate valuation of the holding.

I continue to be proud of being the Honorary Treasurer of our excellent Club and many thanks to Adrian Houstoun our Examiner and long-time member, since 1998, for examining the accounts.
